In Australia we find ourselves in a time of crisis when it comes to Family and Domestic Violence (FDV). In 2018, Western Australia alone, had more than double the number of FDV related deaths than the previous year and nationally 79 women, 25 men and 22 children lost their lives at the hands of an intimate partner or family member (Red Heart, 2019).

This situation is unacceptable and if we continue on this trajectory the fate for our community is scary. Solving this problem is complex and we know that it is vital that we take a whole of community approach to addressing this epidemic.

Rosie Batty knows pain no woman should have to suffer.

Her son was killed by his father in a violent incident in February 2014, a horrendous event that shocked not only the nation, but the world. Greg Anderson murdered his 11-year-old son Luke and was then shot by police at the Tyabb cricket oval.

Rosie had suffered years of family violence and had intervention and custody orders in place, in an effort to protect herself and her son. We are delighted to have Rosie join as at the dinner as she shares her story and journey since Luke's death.

Rosie will challenge what you thought you knew about family violence and share her passion for changing the conversation around family violence to put victims at the centre of all decisions and encourage the community to change their perceptions and stand with women and children experiencing violence.
